Drainage problem: fluid goes in, but does not come out

Usually a "one-way valve" phenomena caused by external issues around catheter

- 1. Bowel interference
- 2. Constipation
- 3. Abdominal inflammation
- 4. Peritonitis
- 5. Omental wrapping
- 6. Abdominal adhesion
- 7. Catheter tip migration
- 8. Fibrin sheath

Inflow problem: fluid does not go in or out

Usually intraluminal problem

- 1. Blood clot
- 2. Fibrin clots
- 3. Catheter kink
